Understand present vision regulations for driving, the proposed regulations, the history behind them, and the reasons for changing; Learn from audience case examples; Understand the demographic problems and medical issues; Learn how to use self and family assessments; Learn clinical evaluation and counseling techniques and resources; Learn about new Bureau of Motor Vehicle assessments and forms; Learn about legal/ethical implications of reporting; Understand the types of vision impairment that elevate motor vehicle collision risk; Learn to what extent vision screening tests can identify older drivers with increased collision risk; Gain insight on recent research on driving with hemianopia; Obtain results from on-road and driving simulator studies and address the important question of how well drivers with hemianopia compensate for their hemifield loss by eye/head scanning; Learn about the most recent research on the on-road performance of visually impaired drivers who use bioptic telescopes; and Learn what driving skills they typically master, and those that are more challenging.
